Homeless Project Update

The team have been undertaking a project to find out about access to healthcare services by people who are homeless. This includes those who are registered as homeless and in priority need with the local authority, 'hidden' homeless such as those who are 'sofa surfing' with family or friends but do not have a permanent stable address. rough sleepers and those staying in hostels and refuges.

This project commenced by mapping out local commissioned and non-commissioned services that support homeless people and creating a partnership network with these agencies to support us to gain access to people experiencing various kinds of homelessness. We have completed our interviews and surveys and the next step will be a report on our findings distributed to local commissioners and publication on our website shortly.

Young Peoples Project



Another of our projects is to find out the needs of young people in Sandwell and their experiences of health and social care. We have been talking to young people about local services including hospitals, GPs, mental health, social care and others. We have met with groups of young people to talk with them about their concerns and the barriers they face. We will be publishing a report later in the year.

This project is expected to lead to the creation of a Youth Healthwatch in Sandwell.

Enter & View Update

We have been continuing our visits to GP surgeries in Sandwell to talk with patients about appointments, suggestions for improvements and Patient Participation Groups (PPGs). So far, we have been to 6 surgeries with more planned for this year. Highlights of our visit are problems getting through on the phone, how easy is it to get an appointment when you need one and knowledge of PPGs. Obituaries

We are sad to hear of the passing of two former board Chairs.



Pam Jones died in November 2019. Before becoming Healthwatch Sandwell Chair, Pam was Chair of Sandwell Local Involvement Network (LINk). She was also well respected for her involvement in other health and social care organisations in the borough.



John Clothier passed away in January. He took over from Pam as Chair in 2016. Before retiring, John was a consultant orthopaedic surgeon at Sandwell Hospital.

Cancer Champions

HWS is part of a project with Cancer Research UK, Sandwell and West Birmingham NHS Trust, and the Clinical Commissioning Group, who are working in partnership to have local people involved to raise awareness about cancer and support people who are affected in Sandwell. The Project is entitled Community Cancer Champions.

The aim of the project, which is taking place across the Black Country, is to improve patient outcomes in relation to prevention, screening and early diagnosis.

The role simply requires local people to take top tips and best practice back to the community setting and help to improve awareness around cancer screening and early diagnosis.

Carers Project Update

We have carried out a project that looks at support for adult Carers in Sandwell. The project aimed to engage with as many Carers as possible including hidden Carers and those not accessing support.

The findings and recommendations aim to inform the development of the Joint Carers Strategy in Sandwell by the Sandwell MBC (Adult Social Care) Key Findings

Levels of caring responsibility

83% of the survey respondents said that they were caring for a member of their family whether that was a spouse, child or another adult family member.

17% of respondents to the survey said that they were caring for a friend or neighbour. 23% of respondents to the survey were full time carers.

Carers Assessments

63% of survey respondents said that they had not had a Carer's Assessment.

Support Services

57% of survey respondents had used information and advice services in the last 12 months. The reports identified the impact on health from caring responsibilities, loneliness, lack of employment opportunities and the impact on finances

The report made several recommendations, which include:

- 1. A publicity campaign by the Local Authority or relevant voluntary sector to publicise tasks which would define a person as a Carer, carer support services and promote the carers assessment.
- 2. Provide a central point of access that would give relevant information to address financial social support, practical support, respite, health information (carers and the cared for) and support for back into employment.
- 3. Promote/provide service for people who provide emotional support to carers e.g. a buddy/befriending service to alleviate loneliness and isolation.
